## Week of action 13 - 21 September 2020



During the above week, the World Council of Churches (WCC) will hold their annual <u>World Week for Peace in Palestine and Israel</u> (WWPPI), which includes the International Day of Prayer for Peace on 21 September. The WCC theme for 2020 is: Creative Solidarity in Common Fragility and can be downloaded by clicking the link.

Along with the suggestions outlined in the WCC booklet, PIEN have come up with our own creative solidarity, linking with the <u>Cry for Hope</u> call that was issued by <u>Kairos Palestine</u> and <u>Global Kairos for Justice</u> on the 1st July, 2020. Will you help us to have a visible focus on Palestine and Israel and raise awareness to your own networks during this week of action.

Many of you will be familiar with the Anglican Church of Gosford and how they have used their church sign to speak out on injustices which has gained them much notoriety and attention. Our creative solidarity idea has stemmed from this.

Actions during 13 - 21 September: We have developed a range of materials to display in various ways.

If you are clergy, or have some involvement in a church group, then please use the WWPPI resources in your worship services and in educational and advocacy events, during this week in September.

Utilize the church billboard with messages such as these ones drawn from the 'Cry for Hope' statement:

- We cry for hope for the Holy Land. Injustice against Palestinians is incompatible with Christian belief.
- We cry for hope for the Holy Land. We reject the oppression of the Palestinian people.
- We cry for hope for Palestine. We believe in a God of love, mercy and justice.
- We cry for hope for the Holy Land. We join Palestinians in their creative, nonviolent resistance.
- We cry for hope for the Holy Land. We believe in a vision of inclusivity and equality for both Israelis and Palestinians.
- We cry for hope for the Holy Land. We embrace Christ's vision to bring love, mercy, compassion and abundant life for all Israelis and Palestinians.
